

B.C. 4-H Volunteer and B.C. 4-H Leader Definitions

The definition of a registered 4-H Leader and non-registered 4-H Volunteer have been clarified to ensure the proper registration is completed and recorded for clubs, districts, regions and the province. Also for resource strategy, enrollment/registration and administration details like financial assessments, tenure awards, insurance, the accuracy of how leaders and volunteers are enrolled is critical.

A. REGISTERED 4-H LEADER

1. As currently defined and included on 4-H Club Enrollment Form #104 (A)

Club Leader (club manager and/or co-leader, etc.)

Assistant Club Leader (including co-leadership)

Project Leader(s)

Program Leader(s)

4-H Key Leader(s)

4-H Resource Leader(s)

2. As enrolled on a district registration form publication # 104(d) and regional registration form publication # 140(c)

Awards Coordinator Safety Coordinator Promotions Coordinator

ALL REGISTERED 4-H LEADERS MUST:

- 1. Have completed 4-H Leader Registration Process, including Criminal Record Search forms. Beginning in 2012, Criminal Record Search every three years.
- 2. Have paid (or someone has paid) their annual enrollment fee
- 3. Are eligible for 4-H Leader Tenure Certificates/Pins
- 4. Are covered by 4-H Accident and Liability Insurance

B. NON- REGISTRED 4-H VOLUNTEER

As recorded on a district, regional, provincial annual 4-H Council Registration form. They include:

- Council Executive (President Elect, President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, etc)
- Leader Registration Committee (Chair and members)
- 4-H Club Sponsors
- Alumni, volunteers, and any others listed on Council Registration

May be enrolled as registered 4-H Leaders IF conditions in section A are met.

All Registered Council members who have their names recorded on a current year's 4-H Council Registration form that is on file with the Manager of B.C. 4-H Provincial Council have the following rights and responsibilities:

- Membership and Vote on the respective council as per constitution
- Are not required to complete Leader Registration Process
- Are not required to pay the enrollment fee that 4-H Leaders do
- Are <u>not</u> eligible for 4-H Leader Tenure certificates
- Are not allowed to work with 4-H members unless supervised by a registered 4-H leader
- Are covered by 4-H Participant Accident Insurance
